1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 10:56 a.m. due to weather conditions.

i) Wellbeing and Accessibility Minutes Re: September 26th, 2024

5. NEW BUSINESS

i) Update from A. Betty, Director of Planning and Community Services

Re: Recommendations on the Parking Strategy

A. Betty, Director of Planning & Community Services, provided an overview on recommendations for the Parking Strategy and provided a handout to the Committee on the Summary of Recommendations and Next Steps.

It was mentioned that she is looking for feedback and if the members had any input to connect with A. Proulx or herself so she can bring the information to Council.

ii) Update from M. Bailey-Viscoff, Recreation Supervisor Re: Bike Camp 2025

M. Bailey-Viscoff, Recreation Supervisor, provided an update on Bike Camp 2025 and noted that Rad Adventures expressed interest in running the kids Bike Camp for ages 6-8 and 9-12.

It was mentioned that the camp would be run out of the Curling Club in Penetanguishene because of the location near the trails.

It was also noted that this program would help improve their skills, trail etiquette, bike maintenance and boost confidence.

iii) Update from M. Bailey-Viscoff, Recreation Supervisor Re: County Age Friendly Grant

M. Bailey-Viscoff, Recreation Supervisor, provided an update on the County Age Friendly Grant.

It was mentioned that the Aquafit program will start in the new year and that she is waiting for confirmation from Waypoint for the final arrangements.

She noted that they did implement three programs in the fall of 2024 as per the following:

- Guided Nature Therapy Walk Series
- Crafting Stories & Art on Paper
- Beginner Line Dancing Series

It was noted that these programs were very well attended and affordable.

It was mentioned that a survey was done and based on the information provided that 50% had a significant impact. Lots of people came out and the main item was to reach people who were isolated.

A question was raised about the Senior Center and it was noted that they will not have any information until the new year.

iv) Update from M. Bailey-Viscoff Re: Gateway Workshops

M. Bailey-Viscoff, Recreation Supervisor, provided an update on the Gateway Workshop and noted that the numbers were up and that people had a lot of gratitude towards the program.

It was mentioned that the program is offered every 4th Thursday of each month which you would have to call to book a session. This program is a one-on-one course and you would need to bring your own device such as cell phone, tablet, laptop or computer.

OTHER DISCUSSION: M. Bailey-Viscoff provided information on the On-The Move program led by the Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit in partnership with school boards, schools, municipalities and community partners.

It was mentioned that the main goal is to help children obtain daily physical activity they need to be healthy by using active forms of transportation for all or part of their school journey (i.e., walking, cycling, skateboarding etc.).

It was noted that James Keating will be involved in this program and a committee will be formed consisting of school staff, Health Unit staff, Municipal staff, parents and student representatives.

v) Progress Update

Re: Workplan 2024-2025

B. Desroches, reviewed with the Committee the Draft Workplan for 2024-2025. The Committee discussed the workplan and provided feedback.

vi) Update from B. Desroches Re: HomeShare Program

B. Desroches provided an overview of the HomeShare program and noted that it is a housing option to work to support older adult home providers looking to share their home to create a mutually beneficial living solution. This program supports aging in place for older adults while providing safe and affordable housing solutions for post-secondary students and other older adults.

It was mentioned that this would be great for older adults needing help around the house by providing snow shoveling, meals or companionship etc. This would be agreed between the person sharing their home and with the home seeker.

It was noted that home providers and home seekers are thoroughly vetted, including a background check, to support matches that are the right fit for all parties. This program provides participants with regular social interaction in a space that is comfortable and familiar and offers opportunities to exchange experiences, knowledge, culture etc.

It was also mentioned that older adults aged 55 and over are eligible for the program and home seekers/individuals,18 years and older students studying at a post-secondary Institution are welcome to apply.

Action: Staff to bring this item to the next meeting.

vii) Snowangels Penetanguishene

Re: Signs

A. Proulx noted that she is looking at promoting the Snow Angel program and is looking at opportunities to encourage volunteers to be part of the program because this is where the program is lacking.

The Committee had some discussions.
